**HLTAID002** – Provide basic emergency life support

**HLTAID003** – Provide first aid

**HLTAID004** – Provide an emergency first aid response in an education and care setting.

HLTAID004 includes all HLTAID001, HLTAID002, HLTAID003 and HLTAID004.

*Current industry standards state that a first aid qualification is valid for a 3 year period with the CPR component to be updated every 12 months.*

## COURSE DESCRIPTION(S)

### HLTAID001

Student learns skills and knowledge to apply cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) according to the Australian Resuscitation Council (ARC) Guidelines. It is for people who may need to offer CPR in various settings, including community and workplace.

### HLTAID002

Student learns skills and knowledge to apply first aid in life-threatening emergencies as stated in the Australian Resuscitation Council (ARC) Guidelines.

### HLTAID003

Student learns skills and knowledge to apply first aid in various settings, including community and workplace.

### HLTAID004

Student learns skills and knowledge to apply first aid to infants, children and adults. It affects educators and support staff who work within an education and care setting who may need to respond to a first aid emergency, including asthmatic and anaphylactic emergencies.

*This unit of competency may contribute towards approved first aid, asthma and anaphylaxis training under the Education and Care Services National Law, and the Education and Care Services National Regulations (2011).*

Course(s) may cover the below procedures but are not limited to:

- Allergic reaction
- Anaphylaxis
- Bleeding control
- Choking and airway obstruction
- Envenomation – using pressure immobilization etc.
- Fractures, sprains and strains
- Head injuries, crush injuries
- Poisoning, seizures and convulsions
- Head, neck and spinal injuries
- Poisoning, seizures and convulsions including febrile convulsions and epilepsy
- Respiratory distress including asthma etc.
