- National Police Check (Fee may apply)
- Working with Children Check (for learner aged 18 years and over, as per WA legislation) **

In order to undertake this qualification, the learner commitment is expected to be at a minimum of 35 – 45 hours a week. This includes face to face classroom training hours, homework and self-study, work placement hours, assignment activities and assessment time.

The course generally runs for 24 weeks excluding holiday.

** For Traineeship / Apprenticeship programs, employer(s) are responsible for all relevant police checks.

WORK PLACEMENT

120 hours minimum work placement within a community service organisation is compulsory for this qualification. Work Placement Insurance will be provided by REACH for Training.
